In 2019, Jackson-Feild partnered with the Klingberg Trauma Stress Institute to implement a traumainformed, trauma-focused treatment model. As a national leader in psychological trauma treatment, Klingberg has helped us enhance clinical expertise, improve children's outcomes, and build a well-trained, stable workforce.

At the heart of this initiative is the Risking Connections curriculum, a restorative approach designed to treat severe trauma and mental illness. Through ongoing professional development and specialized training, staff members gain the tools needed to provide the highest level of trauma-informed care.

Jackson-Feild is one of only two residential treatment programs in Virginia using this model, which—alongside other evidence-based interventions—has been a game changer for both our children and staff.





Vickie's Journey: From Trauma to Triumph



Vickie is a young woman who has overcome incredible hardships including trauma, multiple caretaker disruptions, sexual abuse, drug addiction, and mental health struggles.

Vickie's journey began in the Congo and rapidly became a seemingly never-ending and tragic game of ping pong. As a child, Vickie's parents placed her in the care of her aunt and uncle in the U.S. For three years, the uncle subjected Vickie to unspeakable and repeated abuse. Taken in by a family friend, Vickie was unceremoniously returned to her parents in Africa. When her parents sent her to the U.S a second time, Vickie was once again returned to Africa. It is unclear how the U.S. State Department became aware of Vickie's situation, but the agency determined that Vickie was not safe in the Congo and brought her back to the U.S. permanently.

Placed in foster care, Vickie struggled to adjust, leading to multiple moves. The constant upheaval and psychological trauma left her with deep-seated anxiety and distress. She needed stability and intensive mental health support—something she found at Jackson-Feild.

At Jackson-Feild, Vickie forged a life-changing bond with her therapist, Summer Jones, who helped her see life through a new lens. Ms. Jones guided her in understanding her mental health and learning how to manage it. She also found unwavering support in her cottage staff—Ms. Coleman, Ms. Green, and Ms. Person—who stood by her side, offering guidance and encouragement. For their support, Vickie is eternally grateful.

After completing her treatment, Vickie transitioned to a supervised independent living program in Northern Virginia. There, she graduated from high school and earned her Certified Nurse's Aide (CNA) certification. She is now a student at Northern Virginia Community College pursuing her goal of becoming a medical sonographer while working full-time as a CNA.

Vickie takes immense pride in being drug-free, completing her CNA certification, and earning her high school diploma—achievements that once seemed impossible. She credits Jackson-Feild and its dedicated staff for helping her heal and shape a future she is proud of. Today, she feels hopeful, confident, and excited about the path ahead.

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In memory of Dr. William Delano Bowling


